Crane Operator Certification Port Coquitlam - Crane Operator Certification is a process that enables people to earn a certificate to be able to operate specific kinds of cranes. Certification involves hands-on practice, classroom learning and an aptitude assessment. Several training programs are offered for overhead cranes, mobile cranes, forklifts, boom trucks, tower cranes and other hoisting devices. Trainees would know the fundamentals of safety, equipment characteristics, and operational practices connected with these kinds of cranes.

Customized Practical Training and Evaluation:

Companies can request customized practical training and evaluation on-site at the work facility following the in-class session. Two operators will be trained at a time by an instructor. The duration of time needed for training will differ depending on the employer's levels of ability and equipment type, but generally needs one to two hours. The training would focus on practical skills like for instance planning the lift, right rigging practices and safe operating procedures. Employers need to schedule the on-site session in advance.

Following in-class instruction, practical operating instruction and assessment, and written test, the trainee will receive an individual wallet certificate and the company would be given a wall certificate. In order to to get certification, trainees should have an 80 percent passing score on both practical and written exams.

The program includes: Policies and regulations, manuals; safety concerns; hazards of high voltage; communications and signals; emergency rescue procedures; pre-operational inspection; types, components and terms; pre-lift planning and set-up; crane configuration and capacity; hammerhead / luffing jib crane operations; wire rope and rigging; fall protection; climbing cranes; WHMIS; crane maintenance and First aid & CPR.

To be able to become an overhead crane operator, the minimum requirements include possessing the physical and mental capability considered necessary to carry out crane work. The essential capabilities which are essential consist of depth perception, normal field of vision, manual dexterity, reaction time and coordination. Potential operators must not have the tendency to become dizzy. Operators who do not already have evidence of experience and qualifications should get certification. Operators must be qualified to operate the specific kind of equipment that they will be utilizing to do their job.
