Forklift License Port Coquitlam - Obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification within North America would require the one training to do hands-on training in addition to classroom instruction. The state, provincial and federal regulatory bodies are responsible for the licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators. Operators may obtain a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. In any case, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

Forklifts are powered industrial trucks that come together with various alternatives, like stand-up and sit-down. There are various types and sizes of forklift suitable for various industrial applications. Operator training programs are often individualized in order to deal with the certain types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck inside a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck in a shipyard. The various forklifts and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all industries and machinery. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to focus on specific course requirements but rather on the results of individual training programs.

On the job training which is supplied by the employer is the most common form of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is required to provide practical training and classroom sessions on equipment at their place of work. Employers can choose to train workers on each kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The course incorporates forklift operation methods, forklift maintenance, safety procedures and company policies. Topics specific to the worksite, like dangerous materials or conditions, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate every type of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component with hands-on practice.

It should be noted that employer-provided certifications do not transfer from one employer to the next. Obtaining a lift truck license through employer-provided training permits the operator to operate a lift truck for that particular employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an essential aspect of the forklift license training, even if the particulars of the safety training would be dependent upon the machines being used. Some safety problems would differ for every industry and employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training might have to deal with extra requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, such as in offshore and marine uses.
